NOV	THEREFORE THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS:
	The District shall be called the "Fire Protection District".
2.	The District shall provide services to the area detailed below:  a) The Town of and all properties within its incorporated limits,
	b) An area in the Rural Municipality ofNoshown in bold on the attached
	map in schedule "B", and hereinafter referred to as the ' Rural Fire
	Protection Area",
	c) Further it is agreed by the parties hereto, that the services provided by the District,
	shall be to contain any fire occurring in the said municipalities.
3.	The District shall whenever possible and at the discretion of the Fire Chief or a
	designate, provide such fire fighting equipment and manpower, or rescue services, or
	both, as are available to respond to fire alarms or other requests for assistance
	originating from the area in the District as outlined in the area described in clause 2.
4.	The District may at the discretion of the Fire Chief or a designate, respond to requests
	for assistance made by another fire department outside the Rural Municipality of
	No, the area known as the Rural Fire Protection Area, or

from municipalities covered under Mutual Aid agreements.

- 5. The District shall establish fees or rates, as set out in schedule "C", hereinafter referred to as "fire call out fees", to be charged to the respective municipality, subject to clause 23 and 24, when fire protection or rescue services are provided within the incorporated boundaries of the District.
- 6. The District may respond to alarms or calls from the respective municipalities whether or not steps have been taken to authenticate or confirm that the reported emergency or hazard actually exists. The District shall further be entitled to respond to calls from any person purporting to be located within the boundaries of the District, whether or not this can be confirmed. In the event an alarm or call proves to be false, the District shall nevertheless charge the amounts determined in accordance with schedule "C".

#### COMMITTEE

- 11. The Committee shall be called the "\_\_\_\_\_Fire District Committee".
- 12. The Committee shall be composed of at least three (3) representatives from each of the parties to this Agreement, but it is agreed that each party to this Agreement shall be entitled to additional non-voting representation on the Committee as follows:

Schedule "D". Further, it is recognized that both parties currently share the Fire Hall

### Administrator, Fire Chief, Deputy Fire Chief(s)

- 13. The term of office of each representative appointed, by the said municipalities, to the Committee shall be one (1) full calendar year.
- 14. The Committee shall every two (2) years appoint from the members of the fire department, an executive that consists of three (3) members as follows:

- a) Fire Chief,
- b) Two (2) Deputy Fire Chiefs,
- c) Appointments shall be made based on consultations or recommendations from a majority of the members of the fire department,
- d) The Committee may delegate to the Fire Chief such powers, as the Committee shall, from time to time, deem appropriate,
- e) The procedure to be followed by the Committee in conducting its business meetings shall be as set out in <u>Schedule "A"</u> to this Agreement,
- f) The Committee shall annually develop and provide to each council a budget containing estimated operation and capital costs for the next three calendar years.
- 15. The Committee shall, inter alia have the general power to conduct preliminary negotiations and to report back to the municipal councils of the municipalities first named in this agreement as to their findings; to operate, maintain and use the fire-fighting equipment; to provide training to firefighters; and to recommend for payment, to the councils or designated council, first named, all expenditures incurred in connection with the operation and maintenance of firefighting equipment that is under the control of the Committee.

  - The designated council shall be responsible for all related revenues, expenditures and their administration,
  - The Administrator shall provide an annual financial report to each Council, and financial or other reports as requested by the Committee,
  - d) The powers and duties of the Committee may be broadened or abrogated from time to time as unanimously determined by the parties to this Agreement and evidenced by supplemental written agreements duly ratified by the councils of the respective parties to this Agreement but the councils of the municipalities first named in this agreement shall be the parties that enter into all contracts and/or agreements and pass all necessary bylaws in respect to the said District.

#### FIRE DEPARTMENT

- 16. The fire department shall be called the ") & District Fire Department".
- 17. The parties agree that the fire department whenever possible and at the discretion of the Fire Chief or his designate, provide such fire fighting equipment and manpower, or rescue services, or both, as are available to respond to fire alarms or other requests for assistance originating from the area described in clause 2 and outlined on the map in schedule "B".
- 18. The fire department shall be comprised of a minimum of eighteen (18) members to provide the level of fire protection service desired by the District.
- 19. The fire department members shall provide a recommendation to the Committee on which members may be appointed to a fire department executive. The executive shall

- consist of three (3) members that include a Fire Chief and two Deputy Fire Chiefs.
- 20. The Fire Chief and each Deputy Fire Chief shall hold office for a term of two (2) calendar years,
- 21. The fire department executive shall work with the Committee to develop and implement a standard operating procedures manual, hereinafter referred to as the "SOP", which sets out specific fire fighting procedures and levels of protection or rescue services the fire department will provide to the District.
- 22. The SOP manual shall be adopted by the Committee and ratified by each respective municipality. All future amendments to the SOP manual shall be adopted and ratified in the same manner.
- 23. The fire department executive shall provide a copy of the SOP manual and amendments to each member of the fire department.

#### FIRE SERVICE/RESPONSE FEES

24. The parties agree that the Town of	will be exempt from	the charges set out in
schedule "C"; and It is further agreed that the	Town ofv	vill make payment for
shared costs described in clause 8 and 9, by	levying an assessmen	t on the population of
their respective municipality, through the unif	orm mill rate.	

- 26. The parties agree that the said fee revenue shall be applied against the payments required by the second named party (Rural Municipality of No. 1, under Clause 8 and 9 of this agreement; and It is further agreed that the Rural Municipality of No. will make payment for the balance of shared costs described in clause 8 and 9, by levying an assessment on the population of their respective municipality, through the uniform mill rate.

#### **GENERAL**

- 27. The parties agree to perform and do all acts necessary in order to ratify and confirm this Agreement. In particular, each of the parties agrees to pass a bylaw ratifying the execution of this Agreement.
- 28. The parties agree to make payment of their share of the operating expenses of the Committee by levying an assessment on the population of their respective municipality in an amount sufficient to cover their share of the said costs.
- 29. In the event for any reason, it may become necessary to cancel this Agreement, the assets that are available for distribution after paying all liabilities, shall be paid to the respective municipalities in proportion to the sums paid in respect to their capital investment.

It is understood and agreed that this agreement shall commence on, and be continuous. Any party to the Agreement giving 90 days notice in writing may terminate the Agreement. Any termination of this agreement shall not nullify any prior commitments, passed by resolution of the Committee or ratified by both Councils.

# SCHEDULE "A" attached to Exhibit A and forms part of Bylaw No. 3-2001 Bylaws of the "FIRE DISTRICT COMMITTEE"

- 1. The Committee shall elect by vote, a Chairman who shall hold office for one (1) year.
- The Administrator shall whenever possible be present and record the minutes of all
  meetings of the Committee and shall have charge of and possession of the Committee
  records but shall have no voting powers.
- The Administrator shall provide each member of the Committee and their respective Council with a copy of all minutes of all meetings of the Committee.
- 4. The Committee shall have at least one (1) regular meeting in each year, commencing with the year 2001; one (1) meeting being held on or before the 1st day of April in each year with all other meetings at such time as a majority of the Committee or the Chairman shall from time to time determine.
- 5. The Committee may by motion set regular meeting dates and times.
- 6. The Chairman shall have the power to call for a special meeting of the Committee at such times as he shall deem fit, in addition to the regular meeting set out in paragraph four (4) hereof, upon giving the members of the Committee notice as follows:
- 7. Any three (3) members of the Committee shall have the power to call for a special meeting of the Committee and shall do so by providing the Chairman of the Committee with seven (7) days written notice of their intention to convene a meeting of the Committee.
- 8. No business shall be conducted at a regular meeting or special meeting of the Board unless there is a quorum of four (4) members of the Committee present at the meeting when the meeting proceeds to business.
- 9. Any resolution of the Committee requiring financial contribution by any or all of the municipalities party to the agreement constituting the Committee shall require a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the membership of the Committee approving said resolution, and shall be ratified by each of the parties to the agreement previously referred to.
- 10. Any other resolutions of the Committee shall require a simple majority of the quorum present at the meeting when the resolution is passed.
