## **Rural Bridge Improvements**

SARM is partnering with the provincial and federal government to replace 100 RM bridges over the next four years. This will help toward addressing the current infrastructure challenges in RMs. Many RM roads connect to the provincial or national highway system and weight-restricted bridges can create gaps and inefficiencies in the transportation network. Projects will be cost-shared up to \$500,000, with about 17 per cent of this amount coming from the federal government, while 33 per cent will come from the provincial government with the remaining share coming from the RMs.

## Lake Diefenbaker Irrigation Project

The Province of Saskatchewan announced a \$4 billion irrigation project at Lake Diefenbaker on July 2, 2020. The project will take place in three phases and is designed to irrigate up to 500,000 acres of land from Lake Diefenbaker, more than doubling the irrigable land in Saskatchewan. The project is beginning with an immediate \$22.5 million investment in preliminary engineering and initial construction. Project construction is expected to occur approximately over the next 10 years in three main phases at a cost estimated at \$4 billion.

Saskatchewan is seeking federal funding now to support planning work and will be

seeking significant longer-term funding to support this multi-year, multi-phase construction project.

The province expects to complete further consultations and discussions with stakeholders and First Nations as the project progresses.

## **CUSMA – July 1, 2020**

On July 1, 2020, the new Canada-United States-Mexico Agreement (CUSMA) entered into force.

Signed on the margins of the G20 Leaders' Summit in Buenos Aires in November 2018, CUSMA reinforces economic ties between Canada, the United States and Mexico. In December 2019 certain elements of CUSMA were updated to clear the path toward ratification. CUSMA includes a requirement for a formal review of the agreement at least every six years after entry into force. The agreement will terminate 16 years after entry into force, the Parties can agree to extend the agreement for a further 16 years after each regular review.

# Saskatchewan Agricultural Water Management Demonstrations

On July 20, 2020 Minister responsible for the Water Security Agency, Greg Ottenbreit made an announcement that Saskatchewan is investing \$1 million to partner with 10 stakeholder organizations on 11 agricultural water management demonstration projects. The projects will test innovative solutions, and help inform local science based best practices regarding water management on land in Saskatchewan. One of the projects featured in the announcement today is at the Discover Farm and will be multi-year study that will involve design, regulatory approval, and construction of a drainage system on approximately 40 acres of land. After construction, a field study will evaluate several management practices meant to reduce nutrient runoff. An extension event will be planned during construction for interested farmers and ranchers to observe the process.

### Federal Funding for Municipalities - Announcement

The Federal Government announced it will provide \$19 billion to the provinces and territories to help fund a "safe restart" of the Canadian

The money will focus on seven priority areas, including funding for municipalities as well as the purchase of personal protective equipment (PPE) for front line workers and businesses, a national sick leave plan and child care, improving the state of long-term care, and funding for mental health services.

## Advocacy Update - Strychnine

Advocating for the safe and continued use of strychnine to control the Richardson Ground Squirrel (RGS) population has been a longstanding issue for SARM. The RGS can be very damaging to crop, forage, and livestock production and has historically been one of Western Canada's worst agricultural pests. Over the years, there have been gains and setbacks when it comes to Strychnine as a registered pest control product. In 2018, the PMRA published Re-evaluation Decision PRVD2018-13 which proposed the cancellation of strychnine used to control ground squirrels due to environmental risks of concern for non-target organisms, including species at risk. SARM provided comments on the effectiveness of strychnine where applied properly and the danger of removing the ability for producers to use this product without offering a comparable substitute potentially harming the economic viability of agriculture production across the province. In 2019, the Ministry of Agriculture completed a study evaluating Strychnine baiting on RGS control and effects on non-target organisms which demonstrated the safety and effectiveness of strychnine

use when applied properly and submitted the findings to Health Canada and the PMRA.

In March 2020, Health Canada and the PMRA published Re-evaluation Decision RVD2020-06 which banned the sale of strychnine for use on RGS after March 2022 and the use of strychnine to control RGS after March 2023. After the announcement, SARM worked with various producer groups to advocate for the continued safe use of strychnine to Health Canada and the PMRA and registered a notice of objection. Many RMs also registered their own notices of objection to the decision before July 2, 2020. When the results of the consultation on RVD2020-06 are published, an update will be shared with members.
