

Saskatchewan

Current Rate Structure

- Minimum and maximum rate.
- Rate for 'maintenance and restoration' and another rate for 'shortening of road life'.
- Rates amount to a maximum of 3.99 cents per tonne/KM.



Amendments to The Municipalities Act

- Allows municipalities to negotiate a road use agreement outside of the regulatory structure.
 - Must be applied consistently
 - Does not qualify for appeal to Saskatchewan
 Municipal Board
- Minister may require reporting of agreements.



Regulatory Amendments

- **Definitions** added or updated:
 - bulk haul; alternate receiver; control, direction or hire; and hauler.
- Added process for cancellation of an RMA by municipality or hauler.



New Rate Structure for 2022

- **Single combined** rate per tonne/KM.
- Based on data collected from RMs and the Ministry of Highways:
 - RM Transportation Services Expenses;
 - Percent of road damage related to trucks (engineering standard 90 per cent);
 - Truck vehicle kilometres (traffic counts); and
 - Average truck Payload (14.1 tonnes)



New Rate Structure for 2022

• Rate calculated **regionally** for each of the eight Area Transportation Planning Committees.


