

INVASIVE PLANT CONTROL PROGRAM

(CAP-IPCP 2022-23) CHECKLIST FOR HERBICIDE APPLICATORS

This checklist is for a quick review, for more details about CAP-IPCP 2022-23 see the full Program Guidelines at https://sarm.ca/programs/invasive-plant-control-program/

- 1. RMs must appoint a Weed Inspector for the current calendar year in order for any landowner or the RM to claim through the CAP-IPCP. This appointment must be submitted to the Ministry of Agriculture at crops@gov.sk.ca and letter acknowledging the appointment will be returned to the RM.
- 2. Eligible herbicides and associated weeds, as well as application rates, surfactant/adjuvant requirements, and use (industrial vs range/pasture), accepted under the CAP-IPCP are in the Schedule A document at https://sarm.ca/programs/invasive-plant-control-program/
- 3. Always read and follow the herbicide label to ensure proper application, results and CAP-IPCP eligibility. Herbicide applications made contrary to the product label will not be funded.
- 4. Eligible weeds for the current program include:
 - All prohibited weeds designated under <u>The Weed Control Act</u> (Sask.); and
- 5. **Select noxious weeds** designated under *The Weed Control Act* that are of high concern: absinthe, field bindweed, common burdock, bladder campion, ox-eye daisy, black henbane, hoary cress, hoary alyssum, leafy spurge, Russian knapweed, scentless chamomile*, yellow toadflax, common tansy, white cockle and wild parsnip. - 6. In accordance with *The Weed Control Act*, municipalities are required to **notify Crops and Irrigation Branch upon the discovery of a prohibited weed** and at that time an appropriate control option will be investigated and approved by the Provincial Weed Specialist. RMs will be required to submit a copy of the email sent by the Provincial Weed Specialist as confirmation of consultation on prohibited weeds and recommendations of the herbicide used. - 7. Herbicide applicators **must have a valid Pesticide Applicator License** at the time of the application, or the claim will not be considered for rebate. Applicators that are not RM employees but are contractors must also hold a **valid Pesticide Service Licenses**. Licenses are issued by the Ministry of Agriculture. - 8. Adjuvants/Surfactants must be used where indicated by the herbicide label for the effectiveness of the herbicide and are an eligible expense under the program.
- Herbicide Application Records for <u>each application</u> must be provided to the RM <u>by the applicator</u> for their claim. All licensed pesticide applicators must be maintaining accurate and thorough application records. A template record form is provided on the CAP-IPCP website at https://sarm.ca/programs/invasive-plant-control-program/.
- 10. **Invoices** must be provided to the RM that **break out the cost of the herbicide and any adjuvant/surfactant** used. These invoices must be included with each claim.
- 11. **For application to prohibited weeds only**, also include the invoice for cost of the application on the Prohibited Weed Claim Form.
