
WHERE WE CAME FROM

- x 1990s New transportation policy for Saskatchewan
 - + DHT: get municipalities involved in transportation planning from the grassroots
 - Department looked to SARM/SUMA for advice
 - Advisory committee concept born
 - Southwest Transportation Advisory
 Committee formed as test case
 - × Idea spread across Saskatchewan

"Stakeholders who have to live with the decisions of government must be given the opportunity to play a major role in determining the transportation system" – SARM/SUMA

WHERE WE ARE TODAY

- x 11 ATPCs province-wide
- General memberships include:
 - + Rural/Urban Municipalities
 - + First Nations
- Other (associate) memberships may consist of:
 - + Enterprise Regions
 - Other stakeholder groups (example: industry)
 - + SARM/SUMA



WHERE WE ARE TODAY

- Approximately 285,000 people reside in the South Central region with around 90% living in urban municipalities. It has shown steady growth over the last decade.
- Its location adjacent to the Border of the United States, Canada's largest trading partner, provides the region with an advantage over many other regions from a trade perspective.

WHERE WE ARE TODAY


- Executive Working Committees

 - Meet on matters of provincial interest with MHI



- + 108 Municipalities within borders (62% members)
- + Total population ~290,000
- + 2,803 kms of provincial highway
 - x 1,880 kms of pavements
 - × 836 kms of TMS
 - × 87 kms of gravel
- + ~420 km shortline railway
 - × SRC, RCRR, FLR, LMR & SSR
- + ~19 provincial / regional airports

 - + Improve safety for residents







THE BASICS - BELONGING TO AN ATPC

REQUIREMENTS

- Eligibility for membership/associate membership:
 - + rural/urban municipalities, First Nations
 - + Industry/stakeholders
- Fees charged annually based on population and/or assessment. (Fees are capped).
- You may to attend an AGM Care is taken to ensure EWC is made up of a crosssection of urban/rural members.

BENEFITS

- As a member you are eligible to serve on the EWC.
- You will receive regular updates on EWC activities newsletters, minutes, etc.
- General members are welcomed to attend workshops.
- You will have an opportunity to voice your opinion/comments/concerns with your EWC on transportation issues within your area and attend meeting throughout the year as your municipalities' needs require.

- The SCTPC Region is diverse and the demands on the network are many.
- We see a continued partnership with MHI as vital to spending every dollar wisely while addressing present and future demands.
