

Challenges

Agriculture relies heavily on stable global supply chains. Disruptions, especially for a landlocked province like Saskatchewan, pose significant risks. Interruptions in rail or port services can create a ripple effect that impacts rural municipalities, local farmers, and Canada's economy.

ADDRESSING SUPPLY CHAIN DISRUPTIONS IS CRITICAL TO SASKATCHEWAN'S RURAL MUNICIPALITIES, AGRICULTURAL PRODUCERS, AND INDUSTRIES ALIKE.

Any interruption in rail or port services can cause major impacts to international trade agreements, economic stability, and Canada's export/import market. This, in turn, threatens Canada's economic stability.
